SASKATCHEWAN SPORTS HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE - BILL EBBELS



Winning provincial tennis championships seemed to come naturally to William D Ebbels, as he won the Men's Singles Crown a record eight times - 1948, 1953, 1957, 1961, 1962, 1964, 1966 and 1967. He was a runner-up on seven other occasions.

In 1946, he was a member of the 5 man provincial team that was runner-up to McGill University in the only national university championship.

In 1969, Bill Ebbels represented Saskatchewan in the first Canada Games and was the oldest competitor in the Games at age 49.

Bill Ebbels passed away on April 13, 2006.

Tournament Information

- Players are responsible for confirming their own draw times.
- Draw sizes will be limited to 32 open men's singles, 16 open women's singles, 16 open men's doubles, 8 open women's doubles, and 8 open mixed doubles.
- The Host Committee reserves the right to award eight (8) wildcards in the open singles draws.
- The Host Committee reserves the right to cancel an event if insufficient entries are received.
- All competitors **MUST** be members of Tennis Saskatchewan **or** another recognized Tennis Association.
- All matches will be best of three sets with the tie-break at 6 all. The tournament committee reserves the right to change this format for consolation events. Players losing their first match will automatically be entered into the consolation events. Note that consolation event results will be used for ranking purposes.
- All matches will be scheduled for the Lakeshore Tennis Club (hard surface). If required, the Regina Fieldhouse (gum rubber surface) may be used in the event of inclement weather.
- The 15 minute default and 5 minute warm-up rules will be enforced.
- Wilson U.S. Open Tennis Balls will be used during the Tournament.
- Tennis Canada disciplinary procedures will be enforced. The rulebook "Rules of the Court" sets out the rules and regulations to be followed in sanctioned tournaments. This tournament will be carried out according to these regulations.
- Proper tennis attire is required during matches.
- This tournament is sanctioned by Tennis Saskatchewan.
